Traffic counts for the Main Path on Picnic Point

(Observations are for 20-minute periods; conservative estimates for 4 hours are based on 1-hour stay for each person)

Summary of peak days

- 1) Sunday, October 12, 2008, from 2:00 PM to 2:20 PM:**
 - 72 pedestrians, most in groups of 2 to 8 (estimated 288 over 4 hours)**
 - 14 bicycles**
 - 6 of the bicycles were speeding.**
 - 2 bicyclists rode side-by-side deeply engaged in conversation causing the observer to take evasive action.**

- 2) Saturday, August 1, 2010, from 2:50-3:10 PM:**
 - 69 pedestrians, most in groups of 2-6 (estimated 276 over 4 hours)**
 - 12 bicycles**
 - 8 speeding**
 - 2 stollers**
 - 8 dogs on leashes**

- 3) Sunday, August 22, 2010, from 3:10-3:30 PM:**
 - 42 pedestrians, most in groups of 2-4 (estimated 168 over 4 hours)**
 - 1 dog off leash**
 - 12 bicycles**
 - 7 speeding**

- 4) Saturday, August 28, 2010, from 2:50-3:10 PM:**
 - 56 pedestrians, half single, half in groups of 2-4 (est. 224 over 4 hrs.)**
 - 1 dog on leash**
 - 15 bicycles**
 - 10 speeding**

- 5) Monday, September 6, 2010, 3:10-3:30 PM – Labor Day (65°, overcast, starting to rain):**
 - 83 pedestrians, most in groups of 2-6 (estimated 332/4 hrs if no rain)**
 - 4 dogs on leashes**
 - 9 bicycles**
 - 6 speeding**
