

Lakeshore Nature Preserve Volunteer Report for Summer 2014 (May 6-Sept. 2, 2014)

This report covers individuals and groups who attended volunteer workparties between May 6-Sept. 2, 2014; it does not include hours donated by volunteers working on independent projects. We currently have 5 volunteers working on individual projects with staff supervision.
